

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TRIP INFORMATION

DATES: May 19th – May 23rd

LOCATION:

Our team will once again return to Tijuana, Mexico. The first night we stay at a Hotel in San Diego. The next day we depart for the Mexico border and stay at the Amor camp near Rosarito, Mexico Friday - Monday.

WHAT WE'LL BE DOING:

We will be sharing God's love, serving His Kingdoms cause, building brothers, and building a home for a family unable to provide housing for themselves. We'll be engaging in discipleship, evening worship and building lasting relationships with Godly men.

DOCUMENTION:

All travelers must have a current Passport! (Enhanced Drivers Licenses no longer acceptable). If you don't have a current passport or need to renew yours, please start this process ASAP!!

WHAT IMMUNIZATIONS ARE NEEDED?

No vaccinations are required for U.S. Citizens traveling to/from Mexico via ground transportation. However, COVID-19 vaccines are required for Non-US Citizens (and highly recommended for everyone else). Being up to date with a tetanus shot is also recommended.

• TRANSPORTATION:

The Whidbey Island team will travel to SeaTac in our church van. The other team members will meet us at SeaTac. We'll then fly on Alaska Airlines as a group to San Diego Airport. After arriving in San Diego, we'll rent vans for our ground transportation to, from and within Mexico.

LODGING:

The first night we stay at a hotel in San Diego. The hotel we'll be staying at is:

Friday we'll depart for the Mexico border and stay at the Amor Hacienda camp from Friday - Monday. Part of this experience is living in conditions similar to what the families we're building for are living in. As such, the Amor camp has no electricity or running water. We sleep on the ground in tents and sleeping bags. The camp does have potable water and pit toilets.

TRIP COSTS & PAYMENT INFORMATION

• TRIP COST: \$860.00

o Cost includes airfare, hotel, transportation, hotel and camp accommodations, meals while in Mexico, T-shirts and materials used to build the homes.

- o Final payment due April 15th, 2022.

2022 Family Bible Church Mexico Trip Release Waiver & Consent Form

In consideration of participation in the Family Bible Church (the "Church") Men's Mexico Build Trip, May 19th - 23rd 2022. I agree to participate in the Activities ("the trip") that are sponsored, hosted, or related to the Church, as follows:

Voluntary participation:

I agree that my involvement in the activities is voluntary.

Risk of serious injury or death:

I am aware of the hazards and risks associated with serving in a cross-cultural mission capacity. Such hazards and risks including, but not limited to, COVID-19, death, injury by accident, disease, war, terrorist acts, weather conditions, inadequate medical services and supplies, criminal activity, traffic incidents, and random acts of violence. I voluntarily assume all such risks and recognize such risks have always been associated with missionary service.

COVID-19 Assumption of Risk:

I acknowledge there is an inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 and there is no guarantee I will not be exposed to COVID-19 while participating in the Trip, despite Family Bible Church's' efforts to reduce such exposure. I hereby accept and assume responsibility for all costs associated with emergency evacuation due to personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I agree to indemnify, defend, and hold Family Bible Church, its Elders, officers, agents, independent contractors, affiliates, employees and representatives, harmless from and against any and all costs, expenses damages, lawsuits, liabilities and/or claims arising, directly or indirectly, from or related to any and all claims due to injury, loss, damage or death from or related to COVID-19.

No Duty to Act on Conditions Specific to Participant:

I understand the Church is not qualified to provide medical evaluation or treatment and the number of participants limits the ability of the Church to provide special care or attention to individual participants. As such, I agree and understand the Church has no duty to use information I provided regarding medical conditions or other limitations faced by me.

Pre-existing medical conditions and immunizations:

I attest that I have no medical conditions that would prevent me from performing my duties. I further acknowledge that I will receive all necessary immunizations and will carry any prescribed medication needed to protect me from diseases identified by a medical provider. I will be prepared to provide proof of the necessary immunizations. Failure to do so may prevent my participation in the trip.

Authorization to Engage Medical Treatment:

I grant permission for the Church to authorize medical treatment, call for emergency medical aid and take other measures to secure medical treatment if in the Church's sole judgment, I become ill, sustain injury, or otherwise require medical treatment. I give consent to team physician, emergency aid responder, or other health care provider to administer drugs or medicine or to perform such medical treatment as deemed necessary for pain relief or to preserve my life or health. I assume full responsibility for all medical, rescue, transportation, and other costs incurred and will fully reimburse the Church for any expenses the Church, in its sole discretion, chooses to advance. I understand that access to medical care in an emergency may be limited and that health standards and conditions may be below what I am used to in the U.S.

Coverage of Medical Expenses:

I understand the Church does not provide insurance coverage death, injuries, or medical expenses sustained. As such I agree that I have the necessary/appropriate medical, disability, and life insurance coverage to protect myself and my survivors in the event of injury or death.

Release of Claims:

I release and agree to indemnify the Church (any co-sponsors, hosts, or related organizations), their officers, directors, employees, agents, and volunteers (collectively "Released Parties"), from all claims and liabilities of any kind, known or unknown, including but not limited to claims based on negligence of Released Parties (individually or collectively), related to or arising, directly or indirectly, from my participation in the activities, including travel to/from the activities. This release is binding on me, my representative, and heirs. I have carefully read and understand this document.

2022 MOMENTUM MEXICO BUILD TRIP COVID-19 PROTOCOLS, POLICIES & GUIDELINES:

COVID RELATED TRIP CANCELLATION:

We are scheduling this trip to occur May 19th-23rd with the understanding there could be another trip cancellation due to COVID-19.

- Airfare costs: Should this trip once be cancelled <u>AFTER March 21</u>st, you will be issued an airline credit from Alaska Airlines for the airfare portion of your trip (\$220). Rules and Restrictions for this credit can be obtained from Alaska Airlines Group help desk at: 1-800-445-4435
 - Group name: Family Bible Church, Group ID number: ZJSRTSX
- Amor Trip Fee costs: Should this trip be cancelled <u>AFTER APRIL 19TH</u>, Amor will consider the trip NON-REFUNDABLE and as such, \$400 of your trip costs will have been lost.

PRE-TRIP COVID TESTING:

We will be adhering to the following pre-departure COVID-19 safety policies:

- Amor requires all participants to complete a 10 day pre-departure health checklist (see link on registration page). This needs to be submitted to The Team Leader on the morning of departure.
- Amor also requires that a photo or copy of a <u>Negative COVID test</u> must be submitted to the team leader on the morning of departure.
- The team medic will take each participants temperature Thursday morning prior to boarding the plane and once again Friday morning before entering Mexico to ensure all participants are Covid free before entering Mexico.
- The team will travel with an COVID Instant test kit to test any persons exhibiting Covid-like symptoms.

COVID SAFETY, QUARANTINE & EVACUATION PROTOCOLS:

Should anyone begin exhibiting Covid-like symptoms while in Mexico, the following steps will be taken:

- Every morning, each participants temperatures' will be checked. A person logging a fever or exhibiting symptoms or will be tested in camp. If they test positive or have a fever, they will be quarantined in Amor's volunteer staff house in camp. The person will quarantine for 24 hours. If they test negative the next day and do not log a fever, they may rejoin the team and continue the trip. If they test positive again 24 hours later, they will be evacuated to the US for Quarantine.
- Evacuation to the US will be in a separate vehicle rented (and paid for) by the team for quarantine purposes. The person will drive themselves to the border lead by an Amor staff member. They will quarantine at a hotel of their choice in San Diego for 5 days. They will then contact the airline to reschedule their return flight to Seattle.
- If the infected person is too ill to drive, a determination will be made by FBC and Amor staff on how to proceed.
- All expenses related to evacuation and quarantine will be the responsibility of the infected participant.
- After checking in with Amor Friday morning, we will be following their guidelines. (see link on registration page).

AMOR COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS & POLICIES

Once we check in with Amor (Friday morning) we will be following Amor's guidelines which are as follows:

At Camp:

- The group will be given a map to show the layout of the camp and their designated camping area.
- While in group's designated camping area, face masks are optional.
- Outside of group's designated camping area (toilets, La Cocina, etc.), face masks will be required.

Meals (La Cocina):

- Each group will have their own designated eating area at their camping space.
- La Cocina will serve your group near your designated area.
- Face masks should be worn around La Cocina staff.
- Amor will provide igloo coolers for your camping area and worksite and will clean/disinfect at the end of each day.
- Each person should bring their own personal drinking container that they can fill up from the igloo coolers. Do not share with anyone.

Amor Store:

- The Amor Store will be open for each group based on the colored flag assigned to your group.
- There will be one entrance and one exit to the store.
- Face masks and social distancing required inside and around the Amor Store.
- No one will be allowed to try on clothes.
- Tables/seats around the Amor Store are discouraged from being used.

Shower Enclosures:

- Everyone is strongly encouraged to shower daily.
- Each group will be assigned a colored flag; this flag will be shown when it is your group's turn to use the shower enclosures.
- No solar showers will be kept by the shower enclosures. They must be kept in your individual camp.
- Do not leave any personal items in the shower enclosures; items will be thrown away after each cleaning.

Toilets in Camp:

- Your group will be assigned specific toilets that are for your group's use. They will be labeled with your
 - group's colored flag and you are required to only use those toilets during your stay.
- Hand-washing stations will be provided by Amor near the toilets for your use.
- Toilets will be cleaned multiple times a day by Amor staff.

Worksite:

- Masks must be worn at all times, except for eating and drinking.
- 15 people per worksite. This does not include an Amor team member.
- Group must stay within the marked work area.
- Groups are allowed on the worksite no earlier than 8am & must be in camp by 5pm.
- Once in camp for the evening, no one is allowed to leave unless it is an emergency.
- Required attire: long pants, close-toed shoes, and masks.

Interacting with the Family/Community:

- Social distancing will be required. The family will be given masks and asked to wear them.
- Non-monetary donations (i.e. Bible, blanket) to families are allowed but must be sanitized prior to delivery.
- No VBS or community outreach (interacting/playing with children) allowed.
- No physical contact (hugging, shaking hands) with the family and do not touch or pet any animals.
- Do not share or receive food/drink between your group and the family.

Tools:

- If you bring your own tools, you will be responsible to clean/sanitize those tools.
- Amor will sanitize rented tools daily, as well as between each group. You will be encouraged to sanitize them at the end of each workday, too.

Toilet at Worksite:

- Your group may rent a toilet for their worksite, bring your own toilet seat covers or use the family's with the requirement to sanitize between each use.
- You must wash your hands after using the bathroom.

Cleanliness at the Worksite:

- An area should be designated by your group to clean your hands. In this area should be things
 like a handwashing station (i.e. igloo cooler with soap), sanitizers and supplies to disinfect
 surfaces. Amor will not be providing these items so each group is asked to bring their own
 supplies.
- You are strongly encouraged to wash your hands throughout the day; especially after using the restroom and prior to eating.
- You should have your own personal drinking containers (I.e. water bottles) and not share. If a group is using La Cocina, Amor will provide igloo coolers for water/Gatorade. The group is responsible to sanitize the high-touch areas of the igloo coolers throughout the day.

Monitoring your own Health:

- You will be required to take your temperature in the morning (prior to going to your worksite) and in the evening (around dinner time). All temperatures will need to be logged/written down within the group.
- This should be monitored by the designated Safety Person in the group.
- If you begin to feel ill or log a fever, you will be quarantined inside the Amor volunteer house. Amor and the group will collaborate on the plan of action (i.e. the need to send a participant home).
