
Creation Breakfast Club Sunday Online Sept 20th, 2020



Before we get to our lesson today, I want to explain what prompted me to entertain this topic. When I was a fairly new Christian, we had a small group that met at our old house over in South Dugualla Bay every week. Even though we occasionally had to pause as "The Sound of Freedom" passed over rattling the roof, it was a great time of growth for me in the Bible as we would do whatever Precept Study the women's ministry was doing on Wednesday mornings. One thing Precept is really big on is context, i.e. "Context is King". Basically what that means in studying the Bible, whenever you consider a specific verse you should also ask certain questions like:

- a) The 5 "W's" and an "H". (Who, What, When, Why, Where & How)
 - For example, "Whose mail is it?" Who wrote it and who is the intended reader?
- b) The other example I remember was the "Square within the Squares".



- You look at the verse in the context of the verses surrounding it on either side.
- You look at the verse in the context of the theme of the chapter in which the verse resides.
- You look at the verse in the context of the theme of the book of the Bible in which the verse resides.
- You look at the verse in the context of whether it is in the Old or the New Testament.

How many times have you seen this verse on a card or picture with a beautiful background of a sunset, mountain meadow, or the open road like you see below.



The implication here is that God has delivered this verse specifically for you to inspire and/or comfort you at this given moment. But is that really the case? Take a few minutes to look at this short video clip:
