Dr. Randy Guliuzza is a captivating speaker who presents well-documented and often humorous scientific and biblical talks to audiences of all ages. He has represented ICR in several scientific debates at secular universities and in other forums. Dr. Guliuzza has a B.S. in Engineering from the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology, a B.A. in theology from Moody Bible Institute, an M.D. from the University of Minnesota, and a Master of Public Health from Harvard University. Dr. Guliuzza served nine years in the Navy Civil Engineer Corps and is a registered Professional Engineer. In 2008, he retired as a lieutenant colonel from the Air Force, where he served as 28th Bomb Wing Flight Surgeon and Chief of Aerospace Medicine, and joined ICR as National Representative. He was appointed President and Chief Operating Officer in August 2020.

We have heard Dr. Gulluizza speak several times in class, but I thought it would be appropriate, with our country in the midst of a progressively more violent culture war, to hear him speak this weekend on this particular subject.

100 Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all ye lands.


² Serve the LORD with gladness: come before his presence with singing.
