

At-Home FBC Family Kids Church, THIS WEEK: Easter, April 12

Jesus Christ is Lord (taught in July 2018 and was also one of our 2019 VBS songs)

Philippians 2:9-11 Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father.

Optional discussion questions/conversation starters:

- Background: Who wrote these verses? (Paul) New Testament or Old Testament? Who is Paul? Was he writing a history book? (No, a letter.) To whom? Where was Paul when he wrote this letter to them? (in prison)
- Read Philippians 2:6-8. Spend some time talking about each verse one at a time. Definitely spend time on verse 8.
- Then what happened Sunday morning? Read Matthew 28:1-10. Joyfully discuss!
- Reread Philippians 2:9-11.
- What does it mean to “acknowledge” that Jesus Christ is Lord?
- What do you think it will look like when every “knee bows” before Jesus?
- Ask each person if there is something they would like to say to “praise” God during the prayer this morning. If you’re comfortable with it, suggest that you all kneel on the ground and bow down during the prayer. (This is not the “best way to pray”; it *can* however help us experience the humility and submissiveness of “bowing” before Jesus.) Pray, encouraging each person to say the words of praise they have chosen.
- Play the video again and acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord!

Optional activity during the week: Easter Scavenger Hunt: Colors!

Ask kids to go find and return with 4 individual things, each with one the colors below (toy, stuffed animal, food item...). Talk about how the colors relate to Jesus. Read aloud corresponding Bible passages and teach/discuss.

1. RED – Saved by Jesus’ blood (Romans 5:9)

2. WHITE – Our sin is forgiven (Ephesians 1:7)
3. GREEN – Spiritual Growth (Ephesians 4:15)
4. YELLOW – The Hope of Heaven (1 Peter 1:3-4)
