

[More than Conquerors](#) (song taught in May 2018)

Romans 8:37, 39 We are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. What can ever separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus?

Optional discussion questions/conversation starters:

- Who wrote these verses? (Paul) New Testament or Old Testament? Who is Paul? Was he writing a history book? (No, a letter.) To whom? (The church/Christians in Rome.) Where was Paul when he wrote this letter to them? (Most likely Corinth.) When did he write this letter? (57 AD, during his third missionary journey.) Why did he write this letter? (He was greatly desiring to visit Rome but could not yet go, so he wrote them a letter instead, presenting God’s plan of salvation and righteousness to a church that had not yet received the teaching of an apostle.)
- What does “conqueror” mean?
- Read verses 31-39. These verses give context and answers to the remaining questions. (This passage is one of the many throughout Romans that show how Paul is writing about God’s plan of salvation and righteousness through Christ.)
 - Verse 31: The wording, “If God is for us,” is making it clear that there is no doubt about God being for us.
 - Verses 31-32: God gave up his son so he will surely complete the work that this act was to accomplish: our salvation.
 - Verses 33-34: No condemnation can be brought against a Christian’s salvation because God has already declared a verdict of “not guilty” – He has declared us as righteous.
- What does it mean to be a “conqueror through Him who loved us”? (In the context of this verse, “Him who loved us” means the love Jesus gave by dying on the cross for us.)

- What is the answer to the question, “What can separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus?” Reread verses 38-39. (The answer is also the additional word given after each chorus of today’s song.)
- Reread verses 37-39.
- Ask each person to share something for which they would like prayed. Close in prayer (can be led by one person or each person can pray), specifically including everyone’s prayer requests, and thanking God for his irrefutable gift of salvation and righteousness!
- Finish by singing the song again!
