

*We were just beginning to learn this song when we had to stop meeting together, so we're spending two weeks on this song/verse. Week 1 was last week.*

**Call to Me** (taught in February 2020)

**Jeremiah 33:3** Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know. (Shout it out now: Hallelujah!)

## **Week 2 (of 2)**

*Optional discussion questions/conversation starters:*

- Brief review of last week's lesson.
- Who is "me" in this verse? (God)
- What does it mean to "call to God"? (pray, ask God questions, seek God)
- Who knows *everything*? (God. God knows everything because he *created* everything!) Is there anything that God does not fully know? (nope!)
- Does God want us to know things about life? (Absolutely. God does not want us to be ignorant. He does not want to keep things from us. There are simply some things that our human brains cannot grasp.)
- How does God teach us things about life? (the Bible)
- Sometimes we hear "the Bible" as answers to so many questions that it can become trite or a pat answer. That is so sad! The Bible – God's Word – is genuinely the place that holds the answers to "unsearchable things" about life, the world, God, and us!
- When we read (or learn from) the Bible, are we only learning about life in general, or is God teaching us personally about our individual lives as well? (He's teaching us personally! How amazing is that?!)

- What does this verse say that God will do if we call out to Him? (He will answer us.)  
Wow! Let that sink in! God will answer us! God will answer me! God will answer you!  
This verse clearly states that if we ask, God will answer and tell us “great and unsearchable things we do not know”.
- When we read the Bible, we’re benefitting in two primary ways. First, we’re gaining knowledge about God and knowledge about what God teaches. Second, we’re learning what God wants from and for each of us personally.
- Before we read the Bible, we want to “call on God”. We want to pray first, asking God to open our minds and hearts to not only gain knowledge when we read the Bible, but to also be changed by Him. We are not just reading words when we read the Bible; we are reading words straight from God that he is speaking to us right now! The Holy Spirit helps us receive what God is saying to us while we read. That’s so cool!
- I love how this song ends with “Shout it out now: Hallelujah!” This is not part of the verse, but it’s a perfect way to end this song! Yes indeed, let’s praise and thank God for the incredible gift of his word – the Bible!
- Ask each person to share something for which they would like prayed. Close in prayer (can be led by one person or each person can pray), specifically including everyone’s prayer requests, and asking God to help us read the Bible more and more!
- Finish by singing the song again!
