

Global Partners Corner

This month FBC sent a \$1,000 special gift to Amor Ministries (Mexico) from the Elders COVID-19 Benevolence Fund to help fulfill their previous commitments to build homes for families in multiple locations throughout Mexico by using local volunteers and staff. Since 1980, with a mission to keep families together, Amor works with local pastors in the area to identify families in need.

Children whose families couldn't afford to provide for their basic needs are sent away to orphanages, thus Amor began building homes to keep more families together. More than just building a house, it provides safety and security for a family. Parents can spend less money on rent, and more on their children's education. It means hope for a family's future.

Under the leadership of Tony Giammarinaro, FBC has sent construction teams of 15-20+ men every Spring for the past 5 years to the Tijuana area. This year's trip was cancelled due to the travel ban and shutdown.
